Directions to St. Francis Yacht Club

From Marin County:

Take 101 South, across Golden Gate Bridge. Do not take Lombard Street exit, continue on to stop light on Marina Boulevard (in front of Palace of Fine Arts). Turn right on Baker Street and go one block, turn left on Jefferson Street, then left on Broderick Street, (you will be facing Marina Boulevard), and turn left back on Marina Boulevard (facing the direction from where you just came). Stay on the far right side (waterside) and turn right (directly in front of the Presidio fence) to parking area adjacent to the club. The Club is a large Spanish-style building with a red tile roof at the water's edge.

From Highway 280 and 19th Avenue:

Continue north on Park Presidio Boulevard thru Mac Arthur tunnel. Take the Marina Boulevard exit. Head towards the Marina. Go thru the first stop light and make a right on the next street called BAKER. Make three consecutive left hand turns to get back to the main road. You'll come to a stop sign underneath a huge line of eucalyptus trees, make a right at the stop sign and follow unmarked road to parking lot. The Club is a large Spanish-style building with a red tile roof at the water's edge.

From Highway 101 North:

Upon reaching the city, take the Civic Center/Van Ness exit. Continue on Van Ness towards Fisherman's Warf, and then turn left on Bay Street. Continue down Bay Street until you reach Laguna, turn right. The road will become Marina Boulevard. Stay in the right lane. Turn right at stop sign under huge eucalyptus trees and follow unmarked road to parking lot. The Club is a large Spanish-style building with a red tile roof at the water's edge.

From the East Bay:

Come across the Bay Bridge. While on the bridge, stay in the far right lane. Take the Harrison St. exit towards the Embarcadero. Turn right on Harrison. Turn left on Embarcadero. Turn left onto Bay Street. Turn right at Laguna. The road will become Marina Boulevard. Stay in the right lane. Turn right at stop sign under huge eucalyptus trees and follow unmarked road to parking lot. The Club is a large Spanish-style building with a red tile roof at the water's edge.
